FINDING ABBREVIATIONS & ACRONYMS

These questions are commonly asked about the use of abbreviations: A) what are the standard abbreviations for a specific journal or other resource? B) Where can I find a list of abbreviations used in biblical or ancient studies? C) What are the rules for using abbreviations in a research paper?

- 1. In the Reference section of Miller Library:
 - a. For journal abbreviations related to Bible & theology, and for abbreviations related to the Bible or other ancient literature: see the SBL Handbook of Style (PN147.S26 2014) Also see the SBL Abbreviations summary attached as PDF to this document.
 - b. Most Bible commentary sets list abbreviations for journals and other works cited in their commentary (e.g. Word Biblical Commentary; New International Commentary on the Old (or New) Testament;
 - c. For all other acronyms & abbreviations, see the (4-vol) *Acronyms, Initialisms, & Abbreviations Dictionary*—(Ref) P365.A28 2008.
 - d. For abbreviations related to Greek or Roman antiquities, see *Thesaurus Cultus Et Rituum Antiquorum*—(the Abbreviations Index only): Ref BL727.T48 2004 Abbrev.
 - e. For APA instructions on the use of abbreviations, see the <u>APA Publication</u> <u>Manual</u>, 6th ed. BF76.7 .P83 2010, especially pages 106-111.
